Windjammer Conductors

Jeffrey Dent

Member (#3658) since 2017

Jeffrey Dent was named Conductor of the Repasz Band in December 2019. He served as Associate Conductor from 2003-2019. As one of the Repasz Band directors, he led the band in appearances at Association of Concert Bands National Conventions and directed the Repasz Band in their 2017 PMEA performance in Erie, PA. In 2015 the Repasz Band performed at the Appomattox Surrender 150th Anniversary, reprising their historic role at the original event in 1865. He currently co-chairs the annual Mid-Penn Community Band Festival. As a member of Windjammers Unlimited, Jeff also serves as the Music/Conductor Chair assisting with both music selection and conductor assignments for January/July meets. Jeff, a 1977 graduate of Berwick(PA) High School, grew up playing in the Berwick Colonial Band and Hi-Hats Big Band. He went on to graduate from Mansfield University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelor of Music in Music Education. Jeff taught instrumental music in Hughesville, Hanover, and Jersey Shore School Districts. His high school students were consistent PMEA District, Region, and All-State musicians. The Jersey Shore High School Band made several appearances in Disney's Magic Kingdom Main Street parades and were finalists at the TOB Atlantic Coast Championships for several years. The Jersey Shore Middle School Band was invited to perform at PMEA in 2004 and again in 2014. His students had the opportunity to work and play with Dallas Brass, Boston Brass, Zzyzx Sax Quartet as well as composers Robert Sheldon and Sam Hazo. He also has been a guest director for band festivals in Pennsylvania.

Andy Glover

Member (#423) since 1978

Andrew Glover's diverse career in music has included successful tenures as educator, composer/arranger, performer, conductor, clinician, and publisher. He joined the staff of the C. L. Barnhouse Company in 1998, was appointed President in 2022, and serves as staff composer-arranger and editor. He received a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Central Methodist University, where he studied with Keith House, Ron Anson, and Ronald Shroyer. As a sophomore in high school, Glover's first band arrangement was performed by the school's wind ensemble, and thus began a multi-decade career in composition and arranging. His band works number over two hundred, many published by Barnhouse, and have been performed, recorded, and broadcast by bands worldwide. In college, Glover joined the Detroit Concert Band, conducted by Leonard B. Smith, and performed for four seasons on euphonium. He participated in numerous recording sessions with the DCB, including ten phonograph records of "Gems of the Concert Band" and a documentary film soundtrack. For many years he also performed as a soloist and guest artist. Glover taught briefly in the public schools of Webster Groves and served for seven years as Director of Bands at Rosary High School in St. Louis. As a guest conductor, clinician, soloist, and speaker he has appeared in over thirty-five states. He also worked in the

private sector for over a decade in association management. He is a member of ASCAP, Windjammers Unlimited (#423) and the Association of Concert Bands, where he serves on the advisory council. In May 2013 he received the Distinguished Alumni award from Central Methodist University.

Jay Kahn

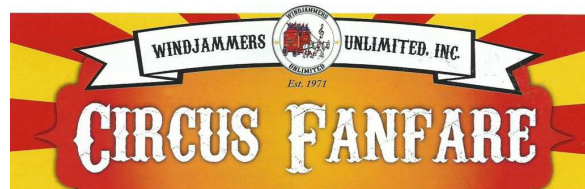
Member (#583) since 1982

Jay Kahn was born and raised in Southern California. He received his A.B. degree in Music Education from Occidental College in Los Angeles, and then went on to earn an M.A. degree in that same field from the University of Iowa. Before starting his teaching career in Iowa, Jay had the opportunity to play trombone with the 12-piece Circus Vargas Band under the direction of Jim Gibson during the 1977 "international" season. Jay now lives in Maquoketa (muh-KOE-keh-tuh), Iowa, where he recently retired after completing 46 years of teaching, 43 of them as Director of the Maquoketa Middle School Bands. In 1996, the Northeast Iowa Bandmasters Association (NEIBA) presented Jay with the Phillip Sehmman Excellence in Teaching Award. In the spring of 1999 he was named a Walmart Teacher of the Year. During the 2008-2009 academic year, Jay served as President of the NEIBA. In 2022, the NEIBA presented Jay with its highest honor, the Karl King Distinguished Service Award. He completed two terms on the Iowa Bandmasters Research and Development Committee, and is currently co-editor of the Iowa Band History Project. Jay has also served as host and audio editor for the annual "Heritage of the March" recording sessions conducted by George Foeller. (The sessions are part of the "Heritage of the March" recording project started by Robert Hoe Jr.) Finally, Jay has directed Maquoketa's Timber City Community Band since 1986. He is on the WJU Board, and hosted the 2024 summer meet in the Iowa-Illinois Quad Cities.

Marvin Manring

Member (#3688) since 2018

Marvin Manring of Stockton, Missouri is serving WJU as a board trustee. He recently retired from public school teaching after 37 years as a high school band director. A native of Albany, Missouri, he attended Central Methodist College (now CMU) in Fayette, and played under the baton of longtime WJU member Keith House in both the college band and professional concert bands in Central Missouri. During his teaching career, his school bands received top awards at state assessments and performed for statewide and regional educational conferences and athletic events. Manring and his wife Mary Anne joined WJU in 2018, and he hosted the 2022 summer convention in Springfield, MO.

Vicki Pinson

Member (#3445) Since 2012

Vicki Pinson taught high school band for thirty years in North Georgia. Under her direction, her bands consistently received superior ratings as well as two Citation of Excellence awards. She serves throughout the southeast as a band adjudicator and clinician. She was Director of Bands at Piedmont College in Demorest, Georgia for twelve years. Vicki was an adjunct Professor of Music at the University of North Georgia and Brenau University. Vicki is an associate conductor and member of the board of the Northwinds Symphonic Band in Gainesville, Georgia. She is a member of Phi Beta Mu, Georgia Music Educators Association, Women Band Directors Association, American School Band Directors Association, and Association of Concert Bands. Vicki has been a member of Windjammers since 2012 and has been a conductor of the band since 2013. Vicki also served as a WJU Trustee.

Lisa Zemlock

Member (#837) since 1985

Lisa is a native of New Holstein, WI and earned her Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh in 1983 and completed her Master of Science degree, also from UW Oshkosh, in 1993. In addition, she has studied conducting with H. Robert Reynolds, Edgar Thiessen, Major Virginia Allen, Berry Ellis, and James Smith. She directed the middle school bands at Winneconne Community School District for 35 years, retiring in 2018. Lisa has served as the conductor of the Oshkosh VFW Band since 2012. She also plays trumpet in the Appleton City Band, the Fond du Lac Symphonic Band, and the UW Fox Valley Concert Band. She plays in several brass quintets and for musical pit orchestras. Lisa has been a member of the National Band Association for 41 years. She served several terms on the NBA Board of Directors as a Middle School Band Representative. She also served as the Wisconsin State Chairman for the National Band Association-Wisconsin Chapter. Lisa currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Wisconsin Concert Band Association. Lisa was elected a member of the Wisconsin Bandmasters Association in 2007 and is currently the President of the organization. She is very active as an adjudicator at solo and ensemble and large group festivals and is a Master Adjudicator for the Wisconsin School Music Association. Lisa is also a member of the International Trumpet Guild, Woman Band Directors International, American School Band Directors Association, and Windjammers Unlimited board of trustees. Lisa is married to fellow Windjammer, Ron Olson who plays euphonium. They have a son RJ who is a student and physical education major at Ripon College.

Guest of Honor, Banquet Speaker

Paul Binder

Paul Binder founded the Big Apple Circus in 1977 and served as its Artistic Director and ringmaster for over thirty years. A graduate of Dartmouth and the Columbia Business School, his early career included stints as stage manager for Julia Child's TV show, *The French Chef* and as a talent coordinator for Merv Griffin. He soon sought more non-traditional pursuits and was a member of the San Francisco Mime Troupe. It was there that he met Michael Christensen and the two of them subsequently traveled to Europe where they worked as street performers. Their routine, combining juggling, comedy and sight gags attracted the attention of the legendary French revue *Casino de Paris*. Annie Frattellini saw them there and invited them to join her company, the *Nouveau Cirque de Paris*. The experience was a revelation. Paul discovered circus as an art form.

From its beginning, Big Apple Circus imbued classic European circus tradition with New York City style and pizzazz. Presented in a one ring format under a big top, it combined elegance, artistic excellence and innovation in every production. It was the first American circus to embrace operating as a not-for-profit corporation, similar to a symphony orchestra, ballet company or opera. Its ties to its home city included circus schools, professional clowns in hospitals, special performances for the visually and audially impaired and performances for underserved communities. Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts was its home for annual holiday performances.

Paul Binder has received honorary degrees as Doctor of Fine Arts from Dartmouth College, the Pratt Institute and Rhode Island College and holds an honorary Doctorate of Human Letters from Long Island University. He has been designated a Living Landmark by the New York Landmark Conservancy. Additional recognition includes being inducted into the International Circus Hall of Fame in Peru, Indiana and the Circus Ring of Fame in Sarasota, Florida. He is the author of a book of circus remembrances, *Never Quote the Weather to a Sea Lion*.



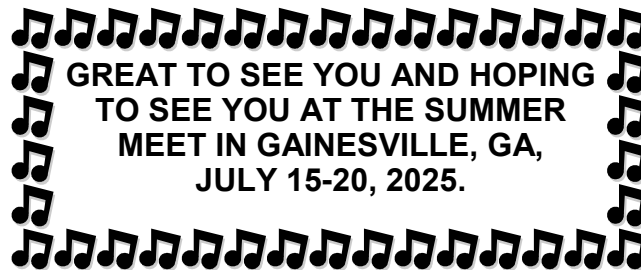
